These shoes represented readiness.

The laced-up shoes or sandals that the Roman legionary wore were the sign of one equipped and ready to move. We, too, must be prepared to share the Gospel of Peace with those around us. Satan has declared war, but you and I are ambassadors of peace.

Our example is the first Passover (Exodus 12:11).

Our command is to be prepared (I Peter 3:15)

What are some ways that we can be prepared to defend ourselves against the devil?

What are some ways that we can be prepared to share the Gospel of Peace?

2 Timothy 2:20-21 helps us to tie in this lesson of preparation with our last series "Way of Agape". How so?
